WHAT TO BRING FOR ePASSPORT PROCESSING

Reminder: Personal appearance of passport applicant is a MUST.

In addition, applicants below 18 years of age must be accompanied by either parent when applying for a passport.

All photocopies for submission must be in A4 size paper.

Note: Releasing of passport shall be by MAIL **only**. For this purpose, applicants need to bring one-self addressed, prepaid LetterPack 500 envelope for the return of their new passport and related documents. [The LetterPack 500 is only available from authorized branches of the Japanese postal service.]

New Passport (For first time applicants born in Japan)

1. Properly filled-out application form.
2. Original Report of Birth and one photocopy.
3. Photocopy of data page of parents' valid passport.
4. If parents are married, proof of marriage duly registered by the Philippine Government. (NSO Marriage Contract / Report of Marriage issued by Philippine consular establishment where marriage was registered).

Renewal of Previous Passport

1. Properly filled out application form.
2. Passport for renewal.
3. Photocopy of the data page of old passport.
4. If applicant is a minor (below 18 years of age), photocopy of the data page of parents' valid passport

Seafarers applying for passport renewal, in addition to items 1-3 listed above, must bring the following:

- 5) Certification from ship master or manning agency in Japan.
- 6) Philippine Seaman's book
- 7) Landing permit issued by Japanese Immigration.

Additional Information:

Holders of old, brown passports must present NSO authentic birth certificates when applying for renewal.

Applicants are advised to bring at least a copy of their birth certificates for verification of personal details when applying for renewal.

USE OF SURNAMES

Case A— Child Legitimized By Subsequent Marriage of Parents

An illegitimate child previously issued a passport under the surname of his/her mother may apply for a passport using the surname of his/her father after being legitimized by the subsequent marriage of his/her parents. (Art.12, Sec.1c, D.O. 11-97)

The applicant needs to present the following:

1. NSO authentic birth certificate / Report of Birth with annotation on legitimization.
2. Proof of marriage of parents duly registered by the Philippine Government (i.e. NSO Marriage Certificate / Report of Marriage issued by a Philippine consular establishment where the marriage was registered).

Case B— Woman Who Opts to Use Her Married Surname

An unmarried/married woman who has been previously issued a passport under her maiden name may apply for a passport using the surname of her legal husband. (Art. 12, Sec.1a, D.O. 11-97).

The applicant needs to present the following:

1. Proof of marriage duly registered by the Philippine Government (i.e. NSO Marriage Certificate / Report of Marriage issued by a Philippine consular establishment where the marriage was registered).

Note: The surname of the husband as it appears in Philippine civil registry records shall be used as the married surname of the applicant.

Case C— Woman Reverting Opting To Use Her Maiden Surname Due to Death of Spouse/Annulment of Marriage/Divorce Initiated By Foreign Spouse

A previously married woman having been issued a passport under her married surname may apply for a passport reverting to the use of her maiden name. (Art. 12, Sec.1b, D.O. 11-97)

The applicant needs to present the following:

C.1 Death of Spouse

- Proof of marriage duly registered by the Philippine Government (i.e. NSO Marriage Certificate / Report of Marriage issued by a Philippine consular establishment where the marriage was registered).
- NSO Death Certificate of Deceased Spouse if death occurred in the Philippines.
Koseki tohon if death occurred in Japan.

C 2 Annulment of Marriage

- NSO Marriage Certificate / ROM with annotation on the dissolution of marriage.
- Philippine Court Order declaring the nullity of marriage, duly authenticated by DFA.

C 3 Divorce Initiated By Foreign Spouse

- NSO Marriage Certificate / ROM with annotation on the divorce.
- Philippine Court Order recognizing the validity of the foreign divorce duly authenticated by DFA.

Passport Application For Adopted Filipinos

The adoption of Filipino children must be done in accordance with the provisions of R.A. 8043, also known as the '*Inter-Country Adoption Act of 1995*'. All adoption cases should be endorsed to the Inter-Country Adoption Board (ICAB), through the International Social Service of Japan (ISSJ) located at Nishimura Bldg 601, 6-18 Kamimeguro 3-chome, Meguro-ku, Tokyo 153 (Tel.No.03-3760-3471)

Qualified Filipinos who have gone through the process of legal adoption may be issued passports reflecting the new adoptive surname after submitting the following:

1. Amended NSO Birth Certificate (showing the new adoptive surname) in security paper authenticated by DFA Manila.
2. Old NSO Birth Certificate (using the original surname) in security paper.
3. Certificate of Registration of Adoption (issued by Manila Local Civil Registrar).
4. Photocopy of Authenticated Court Decree of Adoption.
5. Old passport.

Pursuant to Sec.48, Rule 39 of the Rules of Court and the Supreme Court ruling in G.R. 154380 dated 5 Oct 2005, orders and judgments rendered by foreign courts must be passed upon judicially by Philippine courts to prove its validity. These foreign judgments, which include adoption (except those that passed through ICAB) must be judicially confirmed by filing a civil action at the RTC courts in the Philippines.

Applicants who have been adopted shall submit corresponding proof of the recording of the foreign adoption in Philippine civil registry records.

WARNING:

The Philippine passport shall remain at all times, the property of the Republic of the Philippines, and must be surrendered upon demand by an authorized representative of the Philippine Government.
